

# Marlins run away from Mustangs

Farmington Hills Mercy won its second Catholic League district in girls cross country Tuesday over Birmingham Marian, 19-42.

Mercy's Erin Thomas finished first overall at Cass Benton Park with a 21:23 time. Sarah Polletta was second (21:34). Val Burnisky fourth (22:11). Susan Agacinski fifth (22:35) and Natalie Lowman seventh (23:17).

Mercy's seven were in the top 10 with Anjum Ahmad finishing eighth (23:22) and Christina Andriola ninth (23:31).

"We ran pretty well considering our No. 3 and 5 runners were out," Mercy coach Gary Servais said. "A couple other kids stepped up and filled in nicely."

The Marlins were missing Alyssa Burnisky (injury) and Andrian Milan (illness).

On Saturday, the Marlins were 11th out of 15 teams in the large-school race at the West Bloomfield Invitational.

Polletta finished 14th in 21 minutes even and earned a

medal. Val Burnisky was 57th (22:48), Lowman 61st (22:55), Agacinski 70th (23:14), Milan 84th (24:02), Andriola 85th (24:11) and Ahmad 92nd (24:27).

Servais was concerned about his team's standing, because five regional opponents finished ahead of the Marlins.

"We have to move up somehow," he said. "Hopefully, the veteran kids will get moving, and the rookies will keep improving."

"It was a good learning experience for the rookies and, hopefully, a wake-up call for the veterans."

Thomas, who was unable to finish the dual meet last week, had to run in the JV race based on team rules. Her 21:62 time would have helped the Marlins move up in the varsity meet.
