Rocks romp past River Rats

Raindrops should roll off your windshield the way Plymouth Salem's girls basketball team is rolling through the season.

Salem steamrolled another opponent Tuesday, pulverizing visiting Ann Arbor Huron, 65-25, in a non-conference game in its own gym.

The win was the fifth in as many tries for the Rocks while the Hurons have now split eight decisions.

Talitha Fool paced the visitors with 11 points.

Coach Fred Thomann's team got its usual balanced scoring and team effort as five players combined to score all but one of Salem's points -- and Jenna Van Wagner had that one.

Junior guard Tiffany Grubbaugh scored 18 points and passed off for five baskets by her teammates.

Senior Andrea Pruett netted 13 points plus nine rebounds while Christine Phillips had nine

points and nine rebounds.

Freshman Kelly Jaskot sank two triples in an eight-point effort. Sophomore Dawn Allen contributed six points.

"Grubbaugh had eight and Pruett six in the first quarter," Thomann said. "We really got it going early. Our break was going, our defense was solid. We didn't give them any space to play."

The Rock broke out on top 16-8 after the first quarter and expanded it to 30-17 at the half. In case there was any suspense, Salem squashed it with a 16-6 third period.

Salem plays Livonia Franklin on Thursday to open its Western Lakes Activities Association season then has one final non-conference encounter, Tuesday against Flint Northern.

"We've been playing some great ball," Thomann said. "We've done a nice job of handling our schedule."

MARIAN 57, LADYWOOD 42: Livonia Ladywood learned how far it has to go and what it has to do to get there Tuesday night when Marian hosted the Blazers and gave them a 57-42 lesson in their Catholic League opener.

State-ranked Marian got out its 1-3 half-court trap and stalled it on Ladywood, which chose the wrong method to deal with it.

The Blazers tried going over the top instead of dribbling through but Marian kept picking the passes off and turning them into baskets.

Marian opened with a 24-9 lead in the first quarter but Ladywood settled down and was only outscored by a point, 8-7, in the second quarter.

It was 18-8 in the third quarter, which the Blazers negated with a 17-7 final period.

Nellie Byers had 15 points and Nicole Anacjona 14 to lead Marian. Anacjona also had 10 rebounds and five blocked shots.

Erin Hayden led Ladywood with 13 points, all in the second half.

Melissa Harkes had nine points plus four steals while Michelle Harkes had eight points and six rebounds.

Ladywood (3-4, 0-1) made only 31 percent of its field goals while Marian (5-2, 1-0) made 55 percent of its shots.

BORGESS 53, MERCY 42: The second and third quarters proved to be the difference on Tuesday as Redford Bishop Borgess opened the Catholic League Central Division girls basketball schedule with a victory over visiting Farmington Hills Mercy.

The two teams were tied at 12 after one quarter before the Spartans outscored the Marlins 14-7 in the second quarter to open up a 26-19 halftime lead. Borgess resumed its solid play in the third quarter, outscoring Mercy 12-5 to enjoy its biggest lead of the game, 38-24.

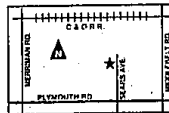
