Weighing in at 2.6 pounds, mea-suring 9, inches long by seven inches wide and 1.3 inches thick, it's much smaller than my Monarch-sized Franklin Plan-rea

The Jornada lists for \$999, though you can buy it from online computer Web sites or through some of the big comput-er stores for as little as \$850.

For two weeks now, I've tried to transition between paper (my Franklin Planner) and electronic (my Jornada). Increasingly, the daily notes page on my Franklin Planner is blank.
