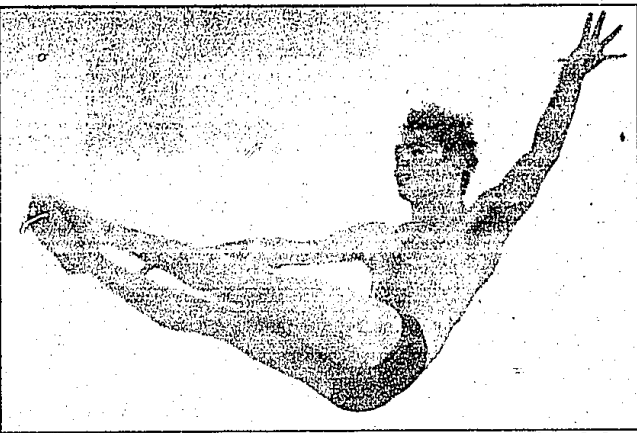

established by Mike Tunney in 1987. Zald also bettered his state-cut time in the 50 freestyle and took over first place in the Observerland rankings with a winning time of 22.30. In all, North had 36 individual best times.

Farber qualified for state in the breaststroke (1:02.68) and also improved his time by more than two seconds in the butterfly (66.59). Both were first-place swims.

"I think Matt was really a sparkplug for the team leadership-wise, getting the kids fired up and coming through with tremendous performances," Duthie said, adding Zald's 100 freestyle time is probably a life-

time best.

Farber swam a strong leg of the breaststroke in the medley relay, Duthie said. Jim Gabriel had a season best in the backstroke (57.15) and was close to his best in the IM; Craig Pasko had his best swims in the IM and 500 freestyle, and Aaron Rycroft dropped three seconds in the 200 freestyle and one in the 100.

"Another person doing real well in Somerset Alver," Duthie said, noting Alver knocked two seconds off his previous best in the 200 freestyle while finishing fourth (1:58.61). He began the season at 2:08.

Gabriel, who won the backstroke, Farber, Mark Wachberg and Zald bettered their state-cut time in the medley relay with a 1:42.10 finish for first place.

Other winners for the Raiders were Joe Lebovic in diving with 219 points and Rycroft, Digla, Zald and Gabriel in the 400 freestyle relay.

"(The Raiders) came to swim is what you can say about them," Duthie said. "Even the kids on the third relay were swimming fast. The kids you figure aren't going to be able to score were swimming fast."

"We haven't had a poor meet, but when we've had to swim

well, like tonight, we've really come through.

"From a coaching standpoint, I thought we had a chance to win the meet, but I didn't think we would win by this large a margin. But, looking at the times going in, you could see one team might have a pretty big score advantage but not a time advantage."

The Raiders are 2-0 against Lakes Division teams and on course to win the title with teams remaining against Westland John Glenn and Farmington on Feb. 11 and 18, respectively.

North has to be considered one of the favorites in the Western Lakes Activities Association Feb. 27. Salem will be trying to win its seventh consecutive league championship.

"League meets are different swimming than dual meets," Duthie said. "I don't want to exclude anybody, but four teams definitely have to be in the running — Salem, Stevenson and (Plymouth) Canton, and I'd have to say we'll be in the picture, too."

"It's kinda nice to be in the situation we are, and the kids are swimming well. They're a very competitive group and they support each other in competitive situations."
