Farmington Hills Police Chief Bill Dwyer has pushed for a bike helmet ordinance. The Commission on Children, Youth and Families also backs the idea.

Thirty-one percent of bicycle deaths in 1987 were riders younger than 16, necording to U.S. Dopartment of Tansportation statistics. East Grand Rapids and Adrian require young riders to wear helmets.

Several years ago, the city council

shied away from a bike helmet ordinance, deeming it too strict. One council member is not sold on the milder version, either.

"It's like the tobacce thing: If kids are not going to wear them," anid Council woman Cheryl Oliverio, who also opposed a tobacco ordinance presented during last year's goals sossion.

She was in the minority, though. "Id like to try it," Mayor Aldo Vagnozzi said.

"Obviously we're very pleased. We think that it's the right appreach." Dwyer. said. "We are trying to decrease the number of injuries to young people bicycling.

"It's a win-win for the community, the police department and for the families and children who will prevent injuries by wearing a helmet."
