

Can I put my pet rabbit outside in the summor? Pet rabbits can do quite well outside in the summer and bene-

fit from the fresh air and sunfit from the fresh air and sun-shine. Be sure to provide the necessary precations to protect your rabbit. Your rabbit should be placed in a large cago with a wire bottom so that other ani-mals do not got into the cage and hurt your rabbit. It is best to have your rabbit up off the ground. This prevents your rab-bit from eating something off the grass or ground that could harm it.

Domestic rabbits do not toler-ato summer heat well, so they should always have access to plenty of water and shelter from the sum

plenty of water and shelter from the son. Finally, any rabbit housed out-side should be examined careful-ly for signs of "fly strike," which results from files laying eggs on fur. Maggots that hatch from the egg burrow into the skin and can cause life-threatening disease in wabbita.

Their train-ability is high and they shed lit-tle if groomed at least once a week. I have noticed they don't bark near as much as most of the other toy breeds. This is a big plus when it comes to raising them in an apartment or condo situation.
