Jewish organizations trying to help."

The volatility of these issues was palpable, with finger-pointing and blame directed from and toward each side. Anger and frustration built, both on the platform and among audience members. The moderator had difficulty keeping the collective emotions to a rolling simmer and was forced to end questions that could likely be asked endlessly. Waxman compared this problem to a parent's position when trying to settle a sibling fight. Both parties angry and emotional, a parent is often hard-pressed to know who started what.

Nathan Fuchs of Lathrup Village thinks such formats at the humanist forum can be helpful but this one was not: Peace is necessary for both sides. One of the things I agree with the speaker on, is the change of government needed. I don't hink this (Israeli) government is willing to make

Both sides are in agreement that communica-tion is necessary. As the group dispersed, thoughtful conversations accompanied small par-ties to their cars, to their homes, issuing silent hopes for peace in their homeland.


