

## POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following are police and fire incidents that occurred in Farmington and Farmington Hills during the past week.

## THEFT

**In Farmington Hills:**  
A guest at Motel 6 on Grand River reported someone stole \$250 in miscellaneous jewelry between March 9-12.

An auger-style post hole and various auger bits were stolen from a 1992 GMC truck parked on Colgate between March 12-13.

Someone stole a woman's wallet containing \$350 cash and credit cards at Buddy's Pizzeria on Northwestern Highway March 14. The victim said she was attending a party and had left her purse unattended along the way with her husband's birthday card.

**In Farmington Hills:**  
Police ticketed teens ages 14-16 for having a house party involving alcohol on Rhonsway March 13. When officers arrived, the revelers were sleeping. Police found a fifth of vodka in a book bag and vomit in the garbage cans. EMS took a 15-year-old to Botsford Hospital after officers couldn't awake him at first.

Police ticketed a Redford male, 18, for assault and battery and being a minor in possession of alcohol during an apparent room

party at Radisson Hotel March 14. A 20-year-old Livonia male said three others assaulted him and stole his pager, chain necklace, watch and two rings. Police also ticketed a 19-year-old Redford male and a 19-year-old Detroit female for being in possession of alcohol.

During the night March 12-13, someone forced open a garage door on Renaissance but nothing appeared stolen. Damage to the door is estimated at \$500.

## MARIJUANA ARREST

**In Farmington Hills:**  
Police arrested a West Bloomfield man, 38, after finding two plastic bags with 10.5 grams of marijuana inside his 1987 Toyota pickup during a traffic stop on Northwestern and Middlebelt at 4:40 p.m. March 13. Police stopped the truck for having a broken brake light. Officers

searched the truck with the driver's permission and found the plastic bags as well as rolling papers and surgical scissors. The driver admitted to "smoking a roach" but denied having any marijuana in the truck.

Police arrested a Walled Lake man, 23, for marijuana possession after finding a gram of the drug in his 1990 Geo parked outside of Roosevelt's on 12 Mile and Orchard Lake around 12:35 a.m. March 15.

## DRUNKEN DRIVING

**In Farmington Hills:**

Police arrested a Livonia man, 42, for drunken driving outside of Gateway Apartments March 13. Officers responded to a domestic spat and found one of the participants inebriated. When questioned, the man said he walked to the apartment complex. Police later saw him driving a 1997 Suzuki Rodeo and stopped him. He had a blood alcohol level of .22 percent, which is more than twice the legal limit of .10 percent.

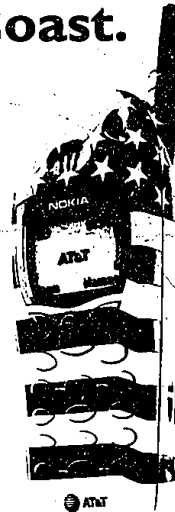
