Fox will share his expertise working with students directly through the liaison program, which has operated in the district for nine years.

The program is one of Farmington Hills' 43 community policing programs, which received national and state recognition last year.

Fox works on site at North Farmington. He'll stress the benefits of such a grassroots program.

"I think they can do something like that (in the Ukraine) and turn things around," Fox said.

After hearing about Project Harmony through a North Farmington teacher, Fox applied and was accepted.

Project Harmony provides cultural exchanges for students and professionals, primarily to Russia and other Eastern Bloc countries.

A federal grant and contributions by the Farmington Optimists, Farmington Exchange and Farmington Rotary clubs and Farmington Hills Police Officers Association is offsetting a majority of the \$2,000 cost. Fox is paying the rest.

As part of the exchange, Fox and members stay with police officers in their homes in Uzhgorod, Ukraine. Fox will also be armed — with a .38 millimeter and digital camera.

"I'm going to be taking a lot of photos," he said.
