## Rite Aid helps to provide free mammogram program

Many women face difficult money decisions every day. If all you had left after paying your rent was \$100, would you spend it to feed your family for a week or on a mammogram that could save your life? While both are important, most women would choose feeding their family first.

This spring, The Rite Aid Women's Health Foundation wants to make it easier for women to choose both as part of its Mother's Day Mammograms initiative.

In its 10th year, Mother's Day Mammograms connects uninsured women in 24 states and the District of Columbia who cannot afford a mammogram with free breast cancer screenings in their community. Programs such as Mother's Day Mammograms can help make a difference in Michigan, which has the eighth highest number of new breast cancer cases in the nation and is tied with New Jersey for the highest breast cancer mortality rates in the country in 1998.

"Last year, 792 women in Michigan received mammograms," as a result of Mother's Day Mammograms, said Beverly Lyons, Michigan spokeswoman. "Of course, we are looking to expand that. Lives have been saved through this program."

"The facts are clear. Early detection of breast cancer saves lives. In fact, when detected early, a woman has a

95 percent chance of survival," said Amy Johnson, executive director of The Rite Aid Women's Health Foundation.

To find out if she qualifies for a free mammogram, a woman needs to:

■ call a toll free number — 1-888-748-3669 — until May 29;

■ answer confidential questions about age, income, medical insurance and health;

■ if she qualifies, she is referred to a participating medical facility to schedule a free mammogram.

Founded in 1988, The Rite Aid Women's Health Foundation is a non-profit, charitable organization established by Rite Aid Corp.

For those who don't qualify but still want to help, they can buy a celebrity mother's day mammogram card at Rite Aid. Dinahann Carroll, stage screen and television star and a breast cancer survivor, designed one of the celebrity cards in cooperation with perate partner American Greetings, which donated the design and production of the cards. The full \$2 purchase price will go to the Foundation's Mother's Day Mammograms program.

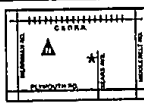
