# Teen pleads

A 15-year-old Walled Lake girl was being held in a juvenile offenders facility after she plead-ed guilty on Thursday to false bomb threat charges.

The girl pleaded guilty to two

The girl pleaded guilty to two felony bomb threat charges before Judge Joan Young, a court spokesman said. The charges stem from a false bomb threat at Walled Lake Central High School earlier this month.

Two other juveniles who were also charged in connection with the incident - a 15-year-old girl from White Lake and a 14-year-old girl from Commerce Township - stood muto on the charges. Not guilty pleas were entored on their behalf, the spokesman said.

A 17-year-old girl accused of being involved in the hoax has been charged as an adult. The White Lake teen is charged with conspiracy to commit a false bomb threat. If convicted of the felony charges, she could face a sentence of up to four years.

A preliminary examination in that case is scheduled for 1:30 p.m. May 25 in 52-1 District Court.

But the girl's attorney, Michael Reeds, said the girl was never read her Miranda rights during her conversation with Hein and Ball. The girl was not told she could leave or given an opportunity to call her parents, according to Ball's testimony.
