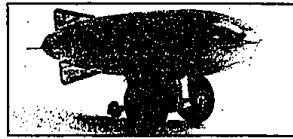

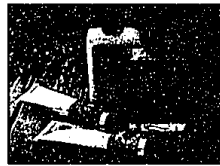

are the franchising possibilities." With Ziebart, Bender was responsible for more than 600 franchises and sees Logo Outfitters as having the same potential for growth.

"I honestly expect to have 800 to 500 locations around the country within three years," he said.

"A franchise will cost about \$120,000 to \$150,000. We still have to build a training center and file the necessary paperwork with the Federal Trade Commission, but we already have a list of eight potential franchisees.

"People are calling us because they recognize our potential."

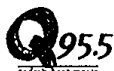

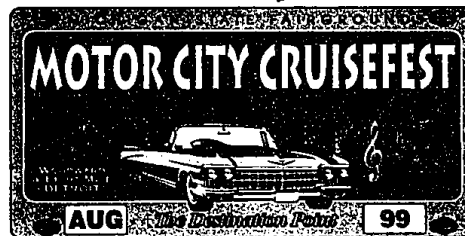
