According to Mike Wiggins, According to Mike Wiggins, deputy director for Farmington Public Safety, the woman was crossing west across Farmington, from a driveway near Real Estate One, when she was struck by the Chevrolet truck.


The injuries to the top of her head were the result of hitting her head on the pavement and not from the collision with the truck, Wiggins said.

Wiggins said the accident could have been much worse had the driver been traveling even at the posted 25 miles-per-hour speed limit. He added that pedestrians need to remember to use nearby crosswalls.

"Cross at Grand River and Alta Loma, don't jaywalk across Farmington Road," said Wiggins, who directed traffic while the woman was attended to. "... But they do it all the time."
