## Farmington Hills woman assaulted

Two women reported they were sexually assaulted last week, one behind a Salvation Army store, where an employee interrupted the attack on a 17-year-old Redford Township girl.

A suspect has been identified by police, but no arrest has been made, Radford police Inspector Donald Mohell said. The two issual assaults are not related to each other, he said.

The other woman, 38, of Farmington Hills told police two men hid inside her van autside a bar in northeast Redford and she was driven to a field at an unknown location, where she was sexually assaulted, police said.

The girl told police that she was walking east on Eight Mile at Poinciana, cast of Inkster Road in northwest Redford, where she was grabbed on her wrist from behind by a man. He pulled the woman south on Poinciana, mumbling soxual reforences about her body, police recorded.
