

# Hills police host 'Benevolent' golf classic

# Board OKs superintendent's contract

As expected, the contract of Farmington Public Schools Superintendent Bob Maxfield was approved Tuesday night by the school board - complete with a nice pay raise.

Maxfield, entering his sixth year at the district helm, will earn about \$150,000, which will

boost him into a salary level similar to superintendents in surrounding Oakland County districts, such as West Bloomfield and Birmingham.

"We're all in concurrence that we're the luckiest school district in the state," said Trustee Linda Enberg about Maxfield, follow-

ing the board's unanimous approval of the contract.

Maxfield's new pact extends through June 30, 2004. He received a 2-percent raise from last year's salary, as well as a one-time-only 3 percent raise, to put his salary on par with the other superintendents.
