While many of their interests and talents dovetall neatly, their music backgrounds couldn't be more different. Steve began playing classical music when ho was 21. Abha hns been at it since she was a toddler. She started playing the flute when she was in the fourth grade. "I loved it, but I was horrible," she said. "My parents sent me to Blue Lake Fine Arta Camp when I was 12 and it was a wonderful experience."


