Farmington Players see a \$175,000 donation from a soon-to-be neighbor as swinging open the barn door to future contributions.



Officials from Sunrise Development, which is building a 76-unit senior assisted living center next door, will present the check to the theater group at 3 p.m. Thursday, Sopt. 9, at another of its facilities under construction on Middlebelt Road.

1960, averaging 6,000 patrons a year for its productions. Sunrise Development officials pledged money to the Farming-

ton Players some time ago, Hadley said. The Fairfax, Va-based company and the theater group have worked together throughout the city planning approval process.

Hadley termed the developer-theater group's relationship "mutually beneficial."

The senier development company found a site next to the present burn. Sunrise also learned the Farmington Players wanted to upgrade their theater.

Sunrise expects to start construction in July 2000. Farmington Players will move productions to a yet-to-be determined site while the theater is being built.

The new 240-seat theater will feature air-conditioning and handicapped access while retaining its rural charm.
