

of Farmington Gymnastics. "We just want to make the kids feel good about who they are and what their abilities are."
 Nearly a thousand youths are enrolled at the facility, which has 1,400 square feet of floor space devoted to gymnastics. Ninety percent are in the preschool and recreational programs.
 "Only about three percent or so remain in gymnastics," Overgaard said, "so our focus is on kids doing different skills and feeling good about themselves and what they're doing."
 Instructors prepare and follow lesson plans, especially for the preschool programs, and use a variety of teaching methods, according to Overgaard.
 "We know what we're doing, what day we're doing it, and what time we're doing it," she said. "Organization is the best thing we have to offer. We provide a lot of feedback to the parents."
 Parents are asked to participate in programs for very young children, and Farmington Gym-

nastics has a viewing room for parents to watch their children while they're in class.
 "If the parents prefer being more active themselves, they can take an aerobics class offered on site by the Fitness Factory while they wait."
 Tours of the facility will be available during the grand opening hours. For \$2 apiece, children can participate in games and face painting, make balloon animals and use the gymnastics equipment.
 "It's a thank you to our customers and any new ones," Overgaard said, adding the event will have a fun, carnival-like setting.
 "We're under new ownership, and we've given the facility a facelift since Dave has taken over. We're celebrating that fact and letting our customers be aware of it."
