The first sentence states the act should not be construed to restrict, extend or otherwise affect the authority of local government. The following sentence reads that a state or federal statute may limit local authori-

ty.
"I'm not sure where they're going with that," Raczkowski said.
Lawmakers will likely concen-

trate on dismantling living wage provisions like the one in Detroit, which not only affects city contracts but nonprofit groups, Raczkowski said. He also assured city council

members the legislation will not be rushed through during the

midnight hour.
