## Comerica bank in Kroger robbed

Police think the man who robbed a bank located inside a Commerce gro-cery store Mon-day might be linked to a sim-ilar Macomb County inci-

The suspect substaged way with \$1,800 from the Comerica Bank located inside the Kreger grocery store at Pontiac Trail and Beck Road, according to Det. Mark Venus of the Oakland County Sheriffs Department. Noone was injured in the robbery. About 3:40 p.m., the man handed a note demanding money to a teller at the bank.
