The fire slarm went off 2:31 p.m. Tuesday. Pirefighters responded to the scene, and found a plumber soldering pipes in the kitchen near a smoke detector. The soldering generated enough smoke to trigger the alarm, but there was no fire, aid 1.t. Mike Garr of the Farmington Hills Fire Department.

"I would hate to have anything bappen to that building while firm working." Garr said of the building, which is a designated national historic site.

The former bed and breakfast, along with its carriage house and restaurant, have been used for weddings. It was sold for \$1.4 million in June by owner John Anhut to Bosteford Hospital, which will use the inn as office space.
