

# Raiders win 3-1 over Vikes

Brian Horr scored two goals Wednesday in North Farmington's 3-1 win over host Walled Lake Central in boys soccer.

He scored his first goal 5 minutes into the game with an assist from Glen Hearn, who gave the Raiders a two-goal lead in the 16th minute.

The Vikings narrowed the margin to 2-1 at halftime, but Horr scored an insurance goal in the second half when he converted a penalty kick.

Horr scored his first goal from a scramble in front of the Central net. On the second goal, Horr had a breakaway in the box when a defender grabbed his shirt and dragged him down.

Frustrated, Horr got the shot away, and the ball went in the net. But the referee had blown his whistle, and the goal didn't count. Horr put the penalty kick in the upper left corner, however.

When he scored his goal, Hearn took a pass in the corner, dribbled along the baseline, put the ball under a sliding goalie and shot it just inside the post.

"It was not a game with a lot of good flow to it," North coach Ron Meteyer said, adding the

"It was nice to get a big win before a big game," Churchill coach Reid Friedrich said. "We were physical and we were tough."

"Our defense has played well since we switched things up. We're shutting people down with Ricky Grain, Justin Parschowski, Brian Ericker, the freshman, and Alan DeLoye back there."

"It was a strong defensive effort anchored by center-defender Mike Dupa and midfielder Rick Burack," Clarenceville coach Randy McCoy said. "It was basically a team effort."

On Wednesday, Clarenceville lost at Southfield-Lathrup, 1-1, as Burack scored the lone goal for the Trojans.

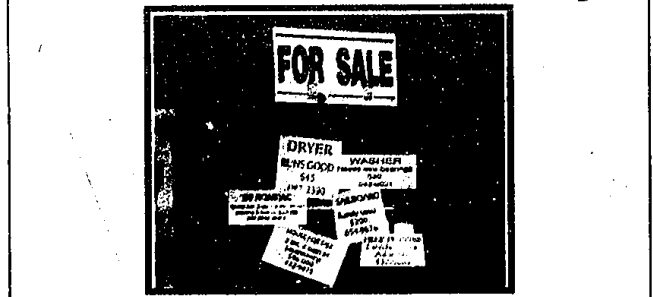
