Families can bring objects to place into their personal time capsules or can make items on the day of the event.

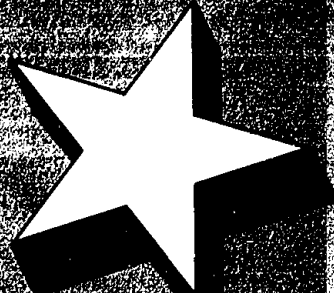
