POLICE AND FIRE NEWS

The following are police and fire reports made during the past week in Farmington and Farmington Hills.

CRACKS STOLEN

Farmington Hills: Two payroll checks totaling \$1,926 were reportedly taken from an office at Elan Engineering, 30785 Grand River, sometime between noon and 6 p.m. Tuesday. The reporting person, 39-year-old Farmington Hills man, said the company wishes to prosecute.

Eight personal checks written for \$2,000 were reportedly cashed without permission after being taken from a residence in the 25000 block of Bridlepath sometime between Oct. 29 and Nov. 2. The victim told police the bank called, alerting him that the checks had been forged by someone other than him or his wife.

FRAUD ARREST

In Farmington Hills: A 23-year-old man was arrested for allegedly attempting to pass a fraudulent check at Com-

erica Bank, 37650 12 Mile, Tuesday. A police report stated the man attempted to cash a check using another person's identification. The bank's loss prevention department contacted 911 when learning the check might be fraudulent.

DRUNK DRIVING ARRESTS

In Farmington Hills: A 49-year-old Farmington Hills woman was cited for operating under the influence of liquor 6:30 p.m. Tuesday at a housing complex in the 30000 block of Grand River. The woman was reportedly responsible for a two-vehicle collision. A breath test showed a .24 blood alcohol limit, exceeding Michigan's legal limit of .10. A LEIN check showed she had two prior drunken driving convictions in Genesee County and in Romeo.

A 28-year-old Novi woman was arrested for operating under the influence of liquor following a traffic stop at 12 Mile and Hagerly early Wednesday. A police report stated she had a prior operating-while-intoxicated con-

viction and her license plate was confiscated. It was replaced with a temporary one and her license was confiscated. A blood alcohol test showed a .20 level.
