Candidates with extenuating circumstances - such as a death, illness or loss of records through fire or other disasters - can ask for a waiver.

"Not knowing where to file or not knowing when the deadline was is not a good excuse for not filing," an Elections Division clerk said.

County commissioners meet twice a month, usually the second and fourth Thursday of the month. Commissioners are paid \$26,111 annually and receive full benefits, which includes medical coverage and retirement. They are also reimbursed for mileage.

Chevy pick-up left the scene but returned an hour-and-a-half later at I-275 and Eight Mile. The Dayton, Ohio man, 30, was taken into custody.

"He said he thought he may have been in an accident and was returning to the scene," Stevens said.

were on the scene to prevent any explosions from leaking fuel.

Road rage takes numerous forms, and motorists are increasingly concerned, said a AAA of Michigan spokesman.

Drivers should allow plenty of time to get to their destination, which alleviates the need to be in a hurry.

"What happens is when people are in a hurry, they do things aggressively," said Jerry Basch, manager of AAA Community Safety Services. "They tailgate, they drive too fast in the passing lane.... All these things irritate other drivers."

Motorists need to realize other drivers make mistakes and not to take it personally, Basch said.

If involved in a conflict, Basch suggests people should drive to a police station or a crowded place.

"Do not get suckered into a situation where you're confronted by a road rage driver," Basch said.

The accident snarled traffic on northbound and southbound I-275 and eastbound I-696 for five hours. Police closed northbound I-275 at Eight Mile until 4:30 p.m. while investigators examined the scene.

The driver of the meat truck told police he saw the Sable veering across the median and tried to brake. A 60-foot-long skid mark on the road led north to the crash, which sheared the front portion of the Sable and caused the meat truck to overturn.

In a recent hit-and-run case, initial police reports had the car traveling in an opposite direction. Ciaramitaro had a hunch and, through subsequent investigation, figured out the vehicle was going north.

"You want to avoid going into an investigation with any preconceived notions. You want to go in with an open mind," Ciaramitaro said.

He started doing accident investigations in 1993 and liked solving the riddles. He's exceeded the standards set by the Accreditation Committee of Accident Reconstructionists, which involves an eight-hour test as well as practical investigation.

With his background, Ciaramitaro has testified as an expert in civil cases.


Sometimes, facts and figures point to an easy solution, but lingering emotional questions remain unsolved.

In 1995, Ciaramitaro investigated three fatal accidents. One involved a 12-year-old boy on a bike who was hit by a drunken driver.

The other two cases involved men, including a Michigan State Police trooper. Both, like Ciaramitaro, had families.

The 10-year veteran had to inform the survivors about their loved ones' deaths.

"That became a tough year. It made me appreciate life," said Ciaramitaro, whose wife had a child this week. "It makes you want to go home and hug your family."


