# Hawks stay in title hunt with OT win over Rocks

Farmington Harrison put itself right back in the Western Lakes Activities Association girls basketball race Tuesday with a much-needed, major victory.

After losing to Plymouth Canton last week, the Hawks knocked off perennial WLAA power Plymouth Salem in overtime, on the road no less, 40-38.

"We knew they were awful good, with three future college players, but I always figured we had a chance to beat them if we played well," Harrison coach Pete Mantyla said.

"We played a tough non-league schedule and our record (6-4) isn't great, but the kids come to every night."

Ari Ault scored 12 points to lead the Hawks. Kelly Taylor had nine, Emily Jackson eight and Cassie Jamison seven. Salem's Tiffany Grubnagh netted 14 points, Christine Phillips nine, Lindsay Klemmer and Andrea Pruett five each.

As a result of the Harrison win, Northville is alone atop the WLAA standings at 4-0. Harrison, Salem, Canton and North Farmington are 3-1. Livonia Churchill and Westland John Glenn have 2-2 records.

"To be honest, we were just trying to get a league win and get back to 3-1," Mantyla said. "We'll keep fighting it out with the top five in the league and see what happens."

Salem (7-3) had a four-point lead with two minutes left in regulation time. Taylor made it a

two-point difference with a pair of free throws after a Salem turnover.

The Rocks missed a one-and-one, and Ari Ault sank a 14-foot bank shot with 15 seconds remaining to tie the game, 35-35.

In overtime, Ari Ault's first field goal of the game was a three. Phillips scored on a put-back, and Ari Ault sank one of two free throws for the final margin.

The Rocks stole the ball with 12 seconds left but missed the layup that would have tied the score.

"Farmington Harrison played solid defense and we didn't do a good job of attacking it," Salem coach Fred Thomann said. "We didn't make plays when we needed them."

Mantyla attributed the victory to the competitive attitude of his players.

"That stems from the seniors and how competitive they are," he said, citing the Ault sisters. "They're the kind of kids who would tear each others heads off in practice."

"Before the season started, I told my players 'Because we have so many competitive kids, I think we have a chance to win some big games.'"

N. FARMINGTON 60, FRANKLIN 28: Sophomore Samantha McComb scored 26 points and senior Katie Vihelle net-

ted 23 points Tuesday for the host Raiders.

Junior Brittany Vihelle added six points. McComb also had seven steals and three assists. All three girls had five rebounds each. Katie Vihelle had five steals, senior Katie Gaffey four steals and four rebounds.

The Raiders, who are 3-1 in the WLAA and 5-5 overall, led 18-4 after one quarter, 34-15 at halftime and 60-20 at the end of three periods.

"Everybody played and contributed," coach Linda Perkins said. "It was a good, all-round team effort, so I'm happy about that."

Tera Merrill scored 13 points for the Patriots, 0-4 and 1-7.

CANTON 66, FARMINGTON 18: Sophomores Christina Kiessel and Janine Guostella combined for 30 points Tuesday to lead visiting Plymouth Canton to the WLAA victory.

Kiessel finished with 17 points, Guostella 13. Senior Janell Twilmeyer added eight points for the Chiefs, 3-1 in the WLAA and 7-3 overall. Canton led 32-13 at halftime.

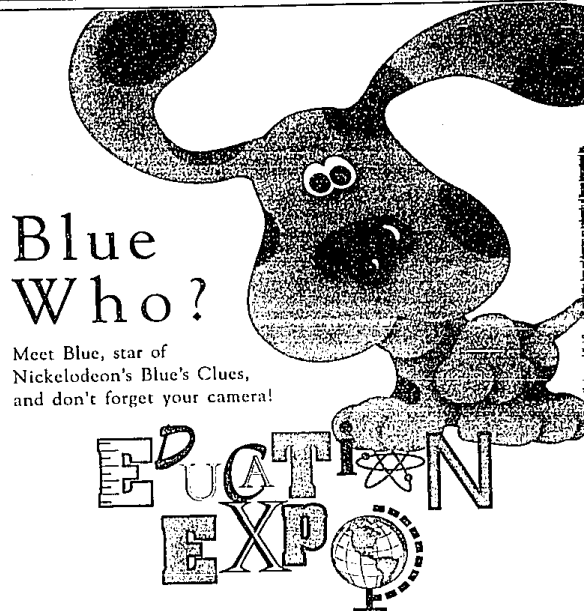
Junior Megan O'Rear scored five points and senior Beth Jager four points for the host Falcons, 0-4 and 1-9.

GLENN 42, CHURCHILL 38: Westland John Glenn built a 25-12 halftime lead and held off a Livonia Churchill second-half surge Tuesday.

Glenn is 5-4 overall and 2-2 in the WLAA; Churchill slips to 0-4 and 2-2. Freshman Stephanie Crews led host Glenn and all scorers with 16 points.

Sister Samantha Crews, a junior, added eight points and 11 rebounds.

Kerrie Gordon, who broke what is believed to be a Churchill single game scoring record (30) last week against Walled Lake Western, finished with a team-high 15 points. All 15 of her points came in the second half, including 11 in the final period.

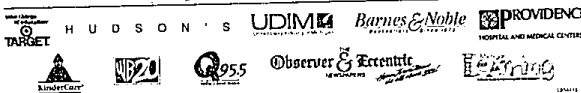

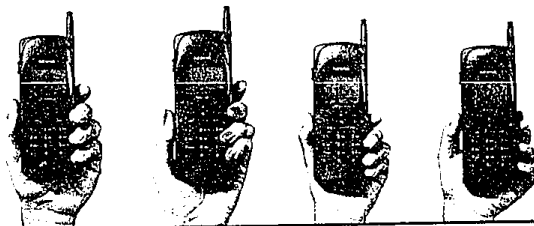
