SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

Notice of Adoption of Ordinance C-16-98, an Ordinance to amend Chapter 34, Zoning, Article III, RA-1A, RA-1B, RA-1, RA-2, RA-3 and RA-4, One-Family Residential Districts, Section 34-55(4), relating to commercial vehicles permitted to be parked as an accessory use.

A full copy of this Ordinance is on file in the Clerk's Office for public review and inspection.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1. Chapter 34, Zoning, Article III, "RA-1A, RA-1B, RA-1, RA-2, RA-3 and RA-4, One-Family Residential Districts," Section 34-55(4), is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (4) Commercial vehicles may be parked as an accessory use to a one-family dwelling subject to the following conditions:
- The vehicle is used as the principal means of transportation for a resident in the conduct of such resident's employment or profession or is the resident's sole means of motor vehicle transportation.
 - The vehicle is not a dump truck, stake truck, tank truck, flat bed truck, step van, wrecker or semi-tractor.
 - No part of the vehicle exceeds eight (8) feet in overall height, measured from the ground.
 - The vehicle has no ladders, tools, pipes or other similar equipment attached or mounted to the outside of the vehicle.
 - The vehicle has no more than one (1) rear axle.
 - The vehicle does not exceed thirteen thousand (13,000) pounds gross weight.


