Hospital seeks hospice volunteers

Beaumont Hospice is seeking volunteers to support the care of patients with terminal illness and their families.

Volunteers must be age 18 or older and have excellent listening skills, flexibility to provide volunteer services at various times of day, and sensitivity to the needs of terminally ill patients and their families. Hospice volunteers perform

a wide variety of activities to meet patient needs including: sitting with patients, active listening, reading, assisting with errands, writing letters and taking the patient to appointments. Volunteers are expected to work a minimum two hours per week.

Hospice is a philosophy of care in which the hospice team (including doctors, nurses,

social workers, chaplain, home health aide homemaker and volunteer) works together to provide specialized care to terminally ill patients and their families.
