Reluctantly I support Clean Michigan proposal because we're stuck with a bill for Engler's incompetent managing of the DNR and DEQ. the DNR and DEQ. Farmington would Farmington would be a loser. In some cases, the district would shoulder 40 percent of educat-ing a transfer.

We need to enact state core curricu lum standards that measure up to globnl standards. Education Action Zones should be set up to attack low standards, which will be responsible for straightening out problems with teachers, parents, community leaders. community leaders. Local businesses and universities would be asked to begin mentoring

and tutoring.
