# Tech whiz moves on to new challenge

Now that Kathy Jones has suc-cessfully hooked up Farmington Public Schools to the technologi-cal age, it's time to move on to a new challenge.

Jones, director of information management and a 12-year employee of the district, resigned to take on a position with Wayne Regional Educational Service Agency. The Farmington school board honored her during a recent meeting.

board honored her during a recent meeting.
Her final day in the district was Friday, Oct. 23.
At Wayne RESA, where she begins on Monday, Nov. 9, Jones hopes to 'be a part of the vision, planning and growth of network-ing districts together." Her title is director of computer services. When she'began in the Farm-ington district, in December, 1986, the administrative offices had a half dozen IBM computers,

ing of Commodore Pets and Apple II's," according to a one-page statement from Jones. Since then, much has hap-pened to bring the district up to technological speed.

The fall 1995 onset of the "Stepping into Technology" project was a major accomplishment of Jones' teaure.

All 1,500 school omplayees were trained in the use of network, e-mail, Internet and voice and data networking were brought into each classroom.

From there, Jones helped drive an information campaign that would help the fall 1997 bond issue be approved at the polls and make way for what is going on currently.

The construction of a fiber optic wide area network, upgrading cabling infrastructures and electronics, will ultimately provide more access for more students at higher speeds.

And the district plans to expand the number of networked computers from about 2,000 to From there, Jones helped drive


