bad, because it would put us ahead in the conference," McComb said.

North, Stevenson and Central entered the final night of the WLLA regular season tied for fifth place.

"We came in fired up and tried to carry it through the whole game," McComb added. "We're keeping our heads up after this one and looking forward to playing next Thursday, whoever we play."

Stephanie Dulz led the Spartans with 12 points. Kate LeBlanc and Cheryl Fox added six points apiece, Guskick five.

North began the second half with a 26-19 lead and managed to stay in front despite 10 turnovers in the third quarter

and two baskets the entire half.

McComb made a three two minutes into the third period for a 29-21 score, but no one made another field goal for North until McComb hit the winning basket.

"Obviously, if we went the whole second half, limiting (McComb) to one basket, that's the right," Henry said.

"She still showed why she's an all-state player. We held her to one basket in the half, and she's still there to make the game-winner."

The Raiders were 10-of-14 overall shooting free throws, but McComb and Vihtelic combined to make seven of eight in the fourth quarter to keep North on top. Vihtelic was 7-of-8 for the

game.

Missed shots came back to haunt the Spartans, who had more size in the post and a lot of second chances.

Stevenson was 3-of-17 from the floor in the third quarter, 7-of-24 for the second half and 14-of-54 overall (26 percent). North was just 2-of-11 in the second half and 13-of-33 overall (39 percent).

"The girls said to themselves every time we had a timeout 'All we have to do is make our layups and we'll win,' but we didn't make enough of them," Henry said.

"You can't take anything away from how hard North Farmington played defense either. We had to work hard to get our shots off."

North countered Stevenson's size and strength inside with scrappy play and hustle under the boards.

"I thought they wanted it more," said Perkins of her players. "They went after the ball tonight like I've never seen them."

Stevenson closed the halftime gap to 29-27 at the end of three quarters. LeBlanc tied it, 34-34, in the last minute. McComb put North ahead again with two free throws before Guskick nailed a shot from the wing that was close to being a three.

"I told Sam: 'There's no other decision to make here,'" Perkins said. "If you don't come off the screen, just get it to the hole like you always do," Perkins said.

"We wanted to get the ball in her hands. It didn't happen right away, so it was a little bit of a struggle. But she's done what I've asked her to do all year — and she finishes. She's hard to stop."

While McComb and Vihtelic receive most of the recognition, Perkins added the other North players perform key roles, too.

"It's a team game and we have great chemistry," she said, adding her players were getting together for a sleep-out Thursday night. "It's the team camaraderie and bonding that pulls them through those tough games. We pulled it off, but it took all of them."

MARIAN 76, ND PREP 30: The host Mustangs scored double-digit points in all four quarters Wednesday.

Senior guard Kellie Dyer tossed in a game-high 21 points for Marian (15-2). Krystal Andrews chipped in 13 points and Nicole Anacjioni had 12 points, 12 rebounds, seven blocks and five steals.

Marian extended a 13-10 first-quarter lead to 57-34 by outscoring Notre Dame Prep 44-24 over the middle quarters.

W.L. CENTRAL 59, FARMINGTON 15: Two, too much. That pretty much sums up Thursday's WLLA battle between Watled Lake Central and Farmington.

Central's twin inside threats, Leah Douglas and Michelle Bartz, dominated the paint and proved to be too much for the visiting Falcons.

Bartz led all scorers with 20 points and grabbed 10 rebounds; Douglas finished with 19 points and 11 rebounds.

The win gives Central a 9-8 overall record and a 6-5 mark in the WLLA. Farmington is 1-16 and 0-12.

Salem rips John Glenn; Canton nips Northville

Plymouth Salem and Plymouth Canton rebounded from their emotional game Tuesday to win Thursday.

Salem crushed Westland John Glenn, 61-22, while Canton claimed a four-point victory over a tough Northville team, 41-37.

Salem (14-3) rolled to a 25-10 halftime lead clinching a tie for the Western Lakes title with Farmington Harrison.

The Chiefs pulled away from a 25-25 tie after the third quarter to defeat the Mustangs. Canton enters the WLLA playoffs 13-4 after finishing the regular portion of the WLLA season with a 9-2 mark. Northville, 11-6, had an 8-3 league record.

Leading the way for Salem with 22 points was junior Tiffany Grubaugh. Christine Phillips scored eight, Kelly Jaskot seven and Andrew Prueff six. Samantha Crews led Glenn with nine points.

Canton had only Janine Gaustella in double figures. She had 12 points and eight rebounds. Elise Thornell scored eight and Annie Marcell seven.

"It was hard," Canton coach Bob Blohm said. "We got a little stronger as the game went on. I was really pleased. The second half was solid."

"In the second half, we were able to get some open-court stuff going. We competed well and so did Northville."

Janel Hasse had 13 points for the Mustangs and her sister Merideth scored eight.

Host Northville made five of 14 free throws while Canton got to the line 25 times and made 12.

"I was pleased with the fact we got to the line," Blohm said. "That was good for us. I like Northville's team. They're a lot like us — hard to play against."
