The statistics didn't lie in Brighton's 17-14 football win Friday night against visiting Westland John Glem.

The host Bulldage outgained the Rockets by nearly a 3-1 margin, but still needed a fourthquarter touchdown by Dave Pearson with 9:53 left in the game to advance in the Class AA-Region III playoffs.

Glem bows out at 8-2 overall, while Brighton improves to 9-1. The Bulldags also stymied Glenn's standout running back Reggie Spearmon, holding the 5-foot-9, 185-pound senior to 69 yards in 15 carries.

Spearmon entered the game with a season total of 1,610 yards, but Brighton, blitzing from all angles, jammed the fine of scrimmage and limited the Rockets to a mere 108 total yards.

Pearson's game-winning touchdown run with just under 10 minutes to play proved to be the difference.


