On July 27, the woman reported a \$50,000 five-carat diamond ring and a \$600 men's bracelet stolen from a dresser in her Claymore home. She told Farmington Hills police she believed the maid service that cleans her home was involved.

Police interviewed two maids who cleaned her house between June 26 and July 23. Both denied stealing the jewelry and offered to take polygraph tests, police said.

The woman received \$2,000 from her homeowner's insurance for the ring, which want's itemized in the policy. A claim was also filed by the maid service's insurance company, which hired a private investigator.

Police became aware of the suspected ruse by checking a list of transactions from area jewelers. Those who deal in jewelry and pawn business send transaction lists to police agencies.
