In your case I would think that your grandchildren will be eligible for their grandfa-ther's Social Security bene-

## 2 honored by Notre Dame for starting scholarship program for students of Irish heritage

William T. Brooks of Troy and Alexander B. McGarry of Rochester Hills were honored Oct. 30 by Notre Dame Universi-ty for their leadership roles in heurching the Notre Dame/Hibernian Scholarship program.
