When it comes to the state semifinals, it seems like these two teams keep reappearing,

The Titans are led by senior tallback Michael Tennessee, who has more than 2,000 yards rushing, including a high of 446 against Mt. Clemens Chippewa Valley.

"If he gets shut down you have to go to someone else or keep trying him," Bye said. "With a team as good as CC, you can't put any number on anything, You don't know if you can do anything against that defense. Their defensive backs are big, strong kids, not midgets like our defensive backs."

Stevenson also has an outstanding senior quarterback, Kurt Hunsanger, and a durable wide receiver, Dave Dunlap.

his brother.

As always, the Titans are big across the offensive and defensive lines and quick at the limebacker and secondary positions.
