

# Suspects in 3 recent Farmington crimes head to trial in circuit court

Three serious crimes hit Farmington within a two-day period early this month. Three defendants charged in those crimes now face trials in Oakland County Circuit Court, following recent hearings in 47th District Court.

Trial-bound are Robert Jackson, charged in invasion with the Nov. 6 home invasion of an elderly couple; David Robert Baynes, charged with the Nov. 6

robbing at knife-point of a veterinary clinic employee; and William Marshall Ford, who faces charges of assault with intent to murder, stemming from a Nov. 7 stabbing incident near Nine Mile-Farmington roads.

"There was so much evidence in each case that it was pretty much procedural," said Farmington Public Safety Director Gary Goss, about the cases going to trial.

William Marshall Ford will be arraigned at 8:30 a.m. Tuesday, Dec. 1, before Oakland Circuit

Judge Steven Andrews, on one count of assault with intent to murder. He remains held in the county jail, without bond, for allegedly stabbing a 16-year-old Farmington Hills teen at about 12:15 a.m. Saturday, Nov. 7. He was bound over for trial Friday by 47th District Judge Marla Parker.

The stabbing victim, a student at Farmington High School, is improving, but isn't close to returning to classes, said FHS principal John Barrett on Monday.

Barrett said the boy and his parents stopped by the school Monday morning. "He's progressing very nicely."

Jackson is charged with two counts of armed robbery and one count of first-degree home invasion. According to police reports, at about 3:30 a.m. Nov. 6, he victimized an elderly couple with whom he had previously lived.

Parker, during a hearing Monday, Nov. 16, bound Jackson

over for trial. The defendant will be arraigned before Oakland Circuit Judge Robert Anderson, at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 3. Jackson's bond remains at \$200,000 cash.

Also facing circuit court arraignment on Dec. 3 is Baynes, who is scheduled to be in court at 8:30 a.m. before Oakland Circuit Judge Alice Gilbert. A 47th District Court spokeswoman said Baynes' hearing on Monday was waived, automatically bounding the case over for trial. Baynes remains jailed, with bond set at \$25,000 cash or surety.

Baynes, said police reports, wielded a knife while demanding an animal anesthetic called Ketamine from an employee at the Village Animal Clinic on Grand River, about 9 a.m. Nov. 5. The employee was cut on her left hand, but was not hospitalized.

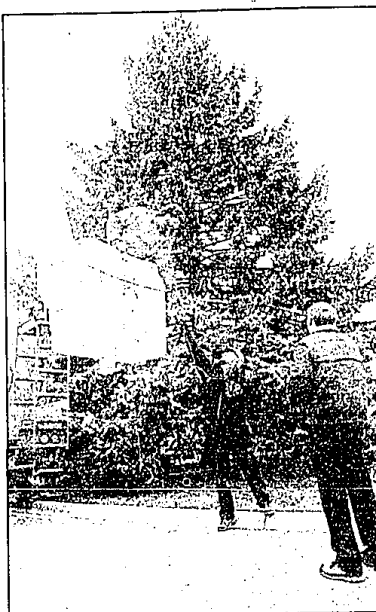
