## Testing ordered for accused vet clinic armed robber

in the man charged with robbing at knifepoint a Farmington veterinary clinic employee for a vial of animal anesthetic must undergo psychiatric testing before his trial begins in Oakland County Circuit Court.

David Robert Baynes, 24, of Farmington Hills was ordered by Oakland Circuit Judge Alice

Gilbert to undergo forensic tests through the Center for Forensic Psychiatry in Ann Arbor, said court spokeswoman Cindy Brown. Ho was arraigned by Gilbert on Dec. 3, on one count of armed robbery. The case was forwarded from 47th District Court. Until the test results return, "his case is on hold," Brown said. Baynes remains jailed, with bond set at \$25,000 cash or sunty.

He is charged in the Nov. 5 armed robbery of the Village Animal Clinic, on Grand Riverin Farmington. According to police reports, a man walked into the clinic, wielding a krife and demanding a vial of Ketamine from a clinic employee.

That employee sustained a small cut on her left hand, but she was not hespitulized.


