### Panda exhibit

A red panda bear exhibit opened in mid December with two new faces. Officially an endangered species, the red panda bears with black logs, a white cat-like face and red raccont tail were wandering around their old exhibit last week before moving into a new space similar to their native habitat in the Himalayan mountains.

"It's the first time we've ever had a red panda born at the zoo," said Kagan. "The new exhibit is 20 times larger with a lot of trees and tufted deer. It's a

multi-species extravaganza."

Just one of a number of births this year, the pandas join two-Grevy's zebras, also an endan-gered species, and a new kanga-roo born in December. Native to the grasslands of Kenya and Tanzania, the zebras number only about 5,000 in the wild due to extensive hunting for their

to extensive hunting for their hides.
"The Grevy's gave birth on two different weekends in front of hundreds of visitors," said Kagan. "Whenever you visit the zoo, that's one of the unexpected events. You never know what will happen."

If you haven't met Hamms yet, stop by to any hit othe rescued black bear. According to Kagan, let's a likable bear especially for someone who's had a pitch fork stuck in his face. At the request of the California-based animal protection organization In Defense of Animals, the Detroit Zoo gave Hamms a home in late July after the bear spent most of his 20 years living in an Iowa backyard. The 600-pound bear, who appeared in two Hamms

beer commercials, was brutalized by intruders, once with a base-ball but and with the pitch fork that left facial injuries. The Detroit Zoo has rescued 30 bears, lions and mankeys over the past two years and is the only zoo in the country recognized by the Association of Sanctuaries as an approved rescue facility.

Coincidentally, the polar bear is one of the animals up for adoption at the zoo as part of the Detroit Zoological Society's "Wildlife Preserves" program. For \$30 (until Jan. 1), you'll receive a plush polar bear, artifox or Siberian tiger, an adoption certificate, color photo, fact sheet, and biannual newalette with information about the zoo. Proceeds go towards the care of the animals, to renovate or build new exhibits, and provide ongoing education for zoo staff. Last year, nearly 1,700 people adopted animals.


