## Kids bring justice to fairy tale world

Three third-grade classes from Forest Elementary School visited 47th District Court on Monday, Dec. 7, to help bring justice to the fairy tale world.
Children used the courtroom of 47th District Judge Marla Parker to stage three mock trails, all from the American Bar Association. Each of the classes performed a trial, while members of one of the other classes sat as the jury and decided the case.
Laurie Fisher's class staged

the case of "The Three Bears vs. Goldilocks." The Bear family sought damages against the young girl for unlawful entry and bad manners. The bears attorney presented compelling evidence – including the remains of the chair destroyed in the incident. The jury returned a verdict for the plaintiffs.

Theresa Walsh's class acted out The Wicked Queen's claim against Snow White that she had stolen her trademark as the

"Fairest One of All." Even though the Queen was captivating on the witness stand, her testimeny did not sway the jury, which delivered a verdict for the young princess.

Jodi Noff's class performed the case of the "Big, Bad Wolf vs. Curly Pig." The Wolf swed Curly Pig for endangering him by leaving a boiling cauldron in the fireplace when he was trying to enter the pig domicile via the chimney. Despite the work of the Wolf's team of attorneys, the jury found for the defendant.

Children also received a tour of the court, and Parker, host of the event, talked about her job and answered questions.


