"The basic approach is a four-step delivery. A five-step is the same as four with a little stutter step to start.

A lot of the time people will have to bring their back foot around to keep from failing over. That is dofinitely not right. The whole approach should be smooth and with the steps in syne with the swing.

Next, get the perfect armswing, it exhibited with a straight backswing.

Next, get the perfect ormswing. It achieved with a straight bookswing, keeping overything straight right through the release and follow through. The biggest part of the arm swing is the hand position. If the hand turns to much before the release and the ball will go left right for left-handreds.

As for body position, this is up to your own individual style of bowling. One crucial element is how you are playing the lanes.

trickin lement is now you are purpose.

If you have dry back ends, and its a little dry at the heads, your ball starts hooking too early.

In this case you want to be down stroking on the ball, to get it going with a down the lane further. You want to stay down at the foul line in order to down stroke it.

If you are up stroking, the ball will have a tendency to hook scener, good for those oily lane conditions.

Now we look at the release, the most crucial part of the whole delivery. The release goes back to where the steps take place, whether four or five steps.

If you are too slow at the line, the ball will go to the right, if the shoulder is open, the ball will hook right away, if he shoulder is closed, the hand have the shoulder is closed, the only thing working the ball is your hand, so you have to stay with the ball and let the momentum carry through the shot.

If you dup the ball, you will turn it more, as that is not best for most more, as that is not best for most booklers who are not used to this typo of release.

ease. It is best to stay with one hand posi tion, the one you are most comfortable with. It is OK to break the wrist back for certain spare shots. If you are getting too much or not enough hook, it is better that the ball it is better that the should be ball to be a second t too much or not enough hook, it is better to change to another bail. It is best to avoid early hook. To make difficult shots, like the corner pins, it's best to stand at the opposite side of the large and try to reduce the hook, there are several ways to do this. To convert the tempia, look at the shadow of the pin and throw directly at that target. A tot of inexperienced bowlers will do better if they learn to lie use or several ways to do this.
