One is House Bill 4169, which would allow a nursing home resident to suspend payment to the nursing home fails to meet public standards. This concept was supported by 82 percent of Michigan respondents to the latest survey recently to the latest survey recently released by Michigan State University's Institute for Pub-lic Policy and Social

Research, a group spokesman said.

The other priority is the bill to require nursing homes to check the criminal background of applicants for nursing home employment.

Should it become necessary to jump start a dead battery, the revoiding the jump. When AAA Michigan offers these tips on how to cope in an emergency situation, recommending that drivers always carry an emergency kit in the vehicle, containing a flashlight, flares or reflective triangle, distress sign, telephone change, first aid supplies and some basic tools.
