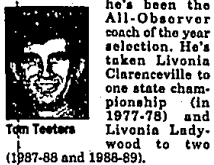


Salem coach earns volleyball honor

At Plymouth Salem the past two seasons, Teeters has taken the Rocks to the state quarterfinals. What made this season's run remarkable is that he did it with a rebuilt team.

Gone from last season were seven seniors, six of whom started at times. Undersized by most standards, Salem still managed to tie for first in the Western Lakes Activities Association with Livonia Franklin and Walled Lake Central.

In the state tournament, however, Teeters and assistant coach Dale Hartzell made the proper adjustments to beat Ladywood in the district final and Franklin in the regional final.

With Phillips filling the need as a hitter, Dombrowski — an all-division pick — could move to setter, where she was an immediate success. She averaged 7.5 assists to kills per game, was second on the team in digs and in kill percentage — and was also second in blocks.

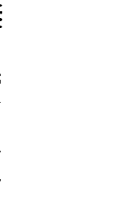

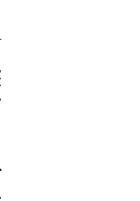

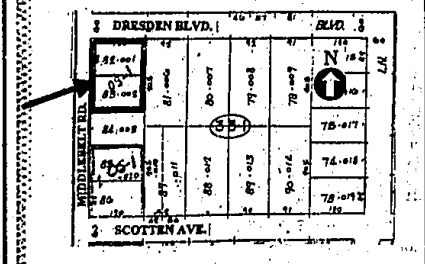
