Coach's firing ends 30 years in Wayne job

The doan of Observerland baseball coaches went the way of former Tiger skippers Les, Buddy and Lary.

One short of his 400th victory, Wayne Memorial coach Jim Chronowski was fired prior to Friday's 11-10 loss at Ypsilant. Chronowski, who compiled a 399-337 record in 30 seasons, was replaced in the interim by Tom Wakefield, a Wayne High business teacher who was serving this spring as an assistant coach at Madonna University.

The decision to relieve Chronowski of his duties apparently went beyond Wayne principal Don Chastain and athletic director Bill Hawley.

Chastain referred all comments on the firing to Waynewestland Schools superintendent Dr. Greg Baracy.

"It's an windertunity situation."

"It's an unfortunate situation for Wayne Memorial High School and I won't discuss the details other than there was an inciden with the baseball team and coach," Baraey said. "There was some inappropriate language used.

After much thought and deliberation, we have decided that behavior is inappropriate for any role model such as a coach, or for that matter any faculty member or administrator for the Wayne-Westland Schools. It just won't be toi-rated. Chronowski, who retired from teaching in the district three years ago, said, "I was never brought in and explained the charges.

charges.
