'Recession proof'

When he announced his bid for When he announced his bid for a third term as Oakland County Executive Tuesday, L. Brooks Patterson said a recession proof Oakland County — along with better reads and more technology — would be his goals over the next four years.

next four years. "I know that's probably unrealistic," Patterson said privately when asked to elaborate. "But it's something we can shoot for." Oakland can, for example, create a business climate that attracts quality companies which are less affected by the cyclic ups and downs normally associated with economic swings, he said. Patterson took note of that presperity Tuesday when he announced his re-election bid at a kickoff breakfast at the Kingsley Inn in Bloomfield Hills before about 150 avid supporters.

Perhaps the most enthusiastic of those supporters was Fred Hoffman, director of state relations for DaimlerChrysler, who introduced Patterson. "During the past seven years of the Patterson administration, Oakland County has earned national recognition and respect as one of America's premier counties," he said. erson administration, Oakland county has earned national congrition and respect as one of merica's premier counties," he aid.

"Under his leadership, Oak-

land County businesses have been afforded the opportunity of initiating or expanding trade opportunities that will allow them to compete on a global scale, Hoffman said, ... transforming Oakland County into a global technology center that can compete with the likes of California's Silicon Valley and Beston's Route 128."

incumbent L. Brooks Patterson in his quest for a third term as Oakland County executive? Patterson, who filed nomining papers with the county elections bureau Tuesday, may or may not face a challenger in the Republican primary on Aug. 8. But he will most certainly face a Democratic challenger in the Nov. 7 general election, according to Gary L. Kohut, chair of the Democratic Party in Oakland County.

still time for a challenger to get on the ballot — Republican or Democrat.

Since the first of the year, Democrate have been evaluating and recruiting possible candidates for county executive as well as other posts including prosecutor, sheriff, county elerk, treasurer, drain commissioner and county commissioner and county commissioner.

We will definitely have some strong candidates, Kohut said.

But we probably won't announce them until Tuesday (the filing deadline).

Also confident about the Democratic slate this fall is State Sen. Gary L. Peters of Bloomfield Hills. "Some people approached me about running (for executive)," he said Tuesday.

But I'm committed to finishing the job voters gave me.

"I'm also exploring a bid for governor (in 2002) when my term is finished," he said.
