# Roads blocked by trees

City crews in Farmington Hills spent Tuesday night and Wednesday morning clearing storm-downed trees and branches, some of which blocked streets.

Baven trees throughout the city were either totally or partially blocking roads, said Tom Blasell, public services director. On Quaker Valley, tangled power lines prevented city crews from removing a tree that blocked the only access to their neighborhood for 20 residents. Halsted in the area of 14 Mile flooded, although the road wasn't closed. Additional flooding was reported north on Eight Mile, between Orchard Lake and Farmington roads, and on Folsom, Blasell said.

"In general, it was pretty good, he said, "Especially if you look at some of our neighbors."

About 300 homes in the Farmington Farmington Hills area lost power during the storm, according to Detroit Edison. The area didn't get hit too hard, in the context of 170,000 customers affected in all of Southeast Michigan, said Edison spokesman Scott Simons.

As of Wednesday morning, 126,000 were still without power.

"For all of our customers, they should be back by late Thursday," Simons said. "It wasn't a record storm, by the numbers, but when you hit 170,000 (outages), that's a catastrophic storm."
