## Teachers challenged to make learning interesting for students

Bill Page called his teacher training talk "Ya Get What Ya Get," and that is exactly the point he drove home during his two-hour presentation, Wednesday, June 14, at the Civic Theatre in Farmington.

"He (a student) has the life he has, he is what he is," Page said.
"Our job is to take the kid and say, Today is the first day of the rest of his life. What can we do to begin to make a difference?"

"We care about every one of them and our job is to teach every one of them. That's our goal."

Page's inspirational, humor-laden talk also challenged teach-ers to "think in terms of making our classes interesting, making our classes exciting, getting our kids involved."
That weaps doing a spoiling

That means doing a spolling test differently: sitting down for the vowels, standing up for consenants. Teachers in the Civic auditorium subsequently bounced up and down while spelling "Michigan."

Page urged teachers to "quit complaining, start teaching," and to realize that they have the power to decide to do things differently, with every single student in mind.

Following the talk, Eagle Elementary School media specialist Carole Kersten said she agraed wholeheartedly" with Page's message.

Deborah Wilson, a teacher at Wooddale Elementary School, said Page's talk reiterated the notion that "your beliefs, what you believe, will influence how you behave."
