Farber sets pool record

Senior Adam Farber set a North Farmington pool record in the 100-yard breaststroke Thursday, winning the event in 1:00.55.

Farber, who also qualified for the state meet with that time, broke his own record of 1:00.77, which he set earlier this season in an intra-school meet.

He also won the butterfly and helped the Raiders win two relays in their first dual meet, but visiting Northville claimed the victory, 102-84.

Other individual winners for North were Sermet Alver in the 50 freestyle and Brian Clayson in the backstroke.

"We looked pretty good in some spots," said coach Pat Duthie said. "In some other places, we weren't as good as we thought we would be. All in all, it was a pretty good first dual meet for us."

Farmington senior wrestlers Mike Murtland and Blake Belsky were undefeated in five bouts each Saturday at Auburn Hills Avondale.

In a team dual tournament, the Falcons lost to Mount Clemens, 56-21, and Ypsilanti Lincoln, 41-24; defeated Avondale, 36-15, and Livonia Clarenceville, 42-30; and lost to Flint Kearsley, 41-39.

Murtland (160) won by void against Mount Clemens and had four consecutive pins with finishing times of 1:12, 4:27, 0:58 and 0:47, respectively.

It was the third straight year Murtland has won all his matches and his weight class at Avondale.

Belsky (215) won his first bout by decision, 12-8, the second by pin (0:21), third and fourth by void and fifth by pin (4:53).

"Blake has made a real good turnaround," coach Al Boyar said. "He started out slow and is starting to pick it up now."
