Ocelots outscore Lady Raiders

A combination of factors carried Schoolcraft College's women's basketball team to an easy 77-52 triumph over Oakland CC Saturday at OCC.

SC improved to 11-2 overall, 4-0 in the Michigan Community College Athletic Association's Eastern Conference. OCC is 6-8 overall, 1-3 in the conference.

Certainly the Lady Ocelots' defense was a main part of the plot — they limited the Lady Raiders to 16 first-half points in building a 38-16 lead.

But it wasn't just SC's defense. "They shot terribly," said Ocelot coach Karan Lafata, noting OCC's 3-for-30 first-half shooting from the floor (10 percent). For the game, the Raiders made just 28 percent of their shots.

Madonna men win hoop shootout

Madonna University owned its Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference men's basketball record at 2-2 with a 92-90 victory Saturday at Indiana Tech in Fort Wayne.

Guard Mike Massey (Walled Lake Western) led the victorious Crusaders (6-13, 2-2) with a game-high 33 points on 11 of 20 shooting from the floor. He was also eight of eight from the free throw line.

Trailing 44-33 at halftime by as many as 16 in the second half, MU stormed back to take the lead on three-pointer by John Bennett (Livonia Churchill) with 4:19 to go.

Chad Nadolni and Massey each hit a pair of free throws in the final minute and Bennett's foul shot with 13 seconds remaining sealed the victory.

"Narvin Russaw added 17 points and 11 rebounds for MU, while Bennett came off the bench to score 16, including four of seven from three-point range. Anron Cox contributed 14 points and six assists.

MU hit 33 of 60 shots from the floor (55 percent) and 17 of 21 from the free throw line (81 percent).

Indiana Tech (9-11, 1-3) was led by guard Tyrus Smith's 27 points. Reserve forward James Patrick contributed 19.

SCHOOLCRAFT 126, OAKLAND CC 79: Schoolcraft College (13-2, 3-1) scored 62 points in the joint Saturday en route to a lopside victory at Oakland Community College (6-9, 2-2). Five Ocelots scored in double figures

MADONNA 92, INDIANA TECH 67:
 Four players scored in double figures Saturday as host Madonna University (8-9, 3-1) rolled to a Wolverine-Hoosier Athletic Conference victory over visiting Indiana Tech (6-10, 1-3).

Kathy Paganalis led a balanced MU scoring attack with 12 points. Kristi Florenzi (Plymouth Canton) added 11 points, while Melissa Poma (Livonia Ladywood) and Mahogany Fletcher (Farmington Harrison) each had 10.

Freshman Tera Morrill (Livonia Franklin) and Nikki Blaszk each had eight for the Crusaders, who hit 41-24 at intermission. Lorron Tachir had five assists.

Madonna outrebounded the Lady Warriors 49-31, MU shot 48.5 percent from the field (33 of 68).

LaShonda Conwell, Thyoshi Chambers and Heather Anderson each tallied 12 points for Indiana Tech.

as 6-foot-8 Sam Hoskin led the way with 29 points (on 13 of 17 shooting) and eight rebounds.

North Farmington's Emir Modunjanin contributed 19 points off the bench on eight of 10 shooting. Mike Peak (18), Derrick Bird (16) and Nick Evola (15) also scored in double figures.

Point-guard Dave McGlown had a team-high 12 assists, while Dwight Windom added eight points and 10 rebounds. Keenan Weir came off the bench to score nine.

Schoolcraft shot 61.7 percent from the field (50 of 81), while Oakland was 26 of 70 (37.1 percent).

Damon Allison scored a team-high 20 points for Oakland, which trailed 59-31 at the half. Others in double figures included Kevin Williams, Jr. (14), Cornelius Stanford (12), James Woodworth (11) and William Motley (10).

The Raiders had 30 turnovers to Schoolcraft's 19.

SALEM 87, W.L. WESTERN 68: Ten months between snow storms is nice but going that long between basketball victories just doesn't make it for Bob Brodie.

Brodie's Plymouth Salem team broke an eight-game slide Tuesday night with a 57-55 victory over visiting Walled Lake Western in a Western Lakes Activities Association game.

Thank you Ryan Hayden, who scored on a layup with six seconds to go, and thank you Dave Hoskins, who scored the other 10 points the Rocks had in the final eight minutes of their first victory this season.

"This feels good," Brodie said. "We just needed a victory bad. To go that long in the season without one..."

"We didn't play that bad all the time. But this is a game where we played pretty well for four quarters. And we did a nice job on the glass."

The Rocks had the ball with 30 seconds to play with the score tied. They called timeout and, when play resumed, ran the clock down before getting the ball inside to senior forward Hayden for the layup.

Walled Lake Western (4-4, 1-1) held a 21-19 lead after the first period but Salem (1-7, 1-1) outscored the Warriors by six in the second quarter to take a 31-27 halftime lead.

Western added three points off that lead in the third period and Salem led only 45-44 entering the final quarter.

Hayden came off the bench to score five points in the game but Brodie was especially pleased with his six rebounds, "which were pretty critical."

Sophomore forward Hoskins led all scorers with 25 points and also had 10 rebounds. He was especially tough in the fourth quarter.

Jeff Haar scored nine points for the Rocks while Nick Tochman also had 10 rebounds, scored nine points "and played a steady game for us," Brodie
