**Farmington music prof invited to Vatican forum**

Wayne State University faculty member Norah Duncan IV has been invited to participate in an international forum on liturgical music at the Vatican.

Duncan, director of the church music division in the music department at Wayne State, is also director of music at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Detroit. "It's quite an honor to be asked to participate in this congress, both as an educator and as a music director," said Duncan, of Farmington. "I'm looking forward to sharing with and learning from my colleagues from around the world."

The International Congress of Sacred Music, sponsored by the Pontifical Council for Culture and the National Academy of St. Cecilia, focuses on the current use of liturgical music within the context of the diverse cultures and traditions that create, teach and use the music.

Duncan's presentation will focus on contemporary liturgical music in North America with an emphasis on the African American tradition and contribution to the liturgical repertoire. He will also discuss various issues facing composers, including creative liberty and relationships with the Catholic Church and other institutions in the liturgical music field. He is the only representative from North America at the congress.

In addition to his duties at WSU and Blessed Sacrament, Duncan has, since 1980, directed activities of the Archdiocesan Chorus and the Cathedral Cultural Series. As an organ recitalist, Duncan has performed here and in Europe. Known as a champion of American organ music, he is particularly interested in music written by African American composers. He is also the recipient of a number of awards including the Award for Excellence for Musical Director from the American College Theater Festival and the St. The Bowman Award for exemplary lay leadership.

WSU's music department is celebrating its 82nd year. Faculty includes renowned jazz artists, composers and members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.
