Anhut and Heeney-Sundquist Funeral Home. The Detroit Edison Company supported a special tribute to more than 50 Chamber members that have backed the organization for 20 years or more.

In presenting the award to Anhut, Observer Publisher Susan Kostek said, "John Anhut is described by his business peers, associates and community leaders as tireless, enthusiastic and results-oriented. His rich history in the community remains a key component of this area's economic vitality."

Owner of Anhut Hotels Company, a three-hotel group that includes the historic Botsford Inn, Anhut was instrumental in the development of Botsford Hospital in 1962. He continues to serve on the finance committee and as chairman of the hospital's Fund Development Council.

His record includes serving as president of the Detroit Hotel Association and Michigan Hotel Association, past Chamber of Commerce president, chair of the Botsford Hospital Board from 1977-79, chair of the Michigan Chamber of Commerce from 1988 to 1990, leader of the Governor Warner Mansion Committee in 2000 and chair of the Farmington Hills Economic Development Commission since 1996.

Anhut said one of his goals for the coming year was to foster more partnerships between the communities of Farmington and Farmington Hills, with regard to their shared resources, like the Warner Mansion, Botsford Hospital and the Civic Theater.

In nominating Partnership honoree Heeney-Sundquist Funeral Home, Mary Bush of Cornwell and Bush Real Estate wrote, "Walter Sundquist and his partner Mark Ziegler are outstanding and contributing members of the Farmington Area community. They are active in civic organizations, the Downtown Development Authority and Walter served for a number of years on the Chamber Board."

Celebrating its 150th anniversary last year, the funeral home has received many local and state-wide beautification awards for the upkeep of its historic building and surroundings. Heeney-Sundquist is one of Oakland County's oldest businesses and the seventh oldest in the State of Michigan.

CITY COUNCIL

TOOK THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

- Acknowledged the City's Outstanding Employees and the Police Officer and Firefighter for the Year 2000.
- Scheduled consideration of request for Council to address compatibility ordinance and planning commission approval of Site Condo Plan 3, 2000 for council meeting of February 12, 2001.
- Introduced ordinances to:
 - Rezone certain properties located between Twelve and Thirteen Mile Roads, east of Orchard Lake from RA-1, Single-Family Residential District to RA-2B, Single-Family Residential District classification.
 - Regulate location, slope and landscape standards for construction of retention ponds within subdivision plats and site condominium plans.
- Adjourned public hearing and consideration of request from Robert Bosch Corporation to amend previously approved Industrial Facilities Exemption Certificate to February 12, 2001.
- Established February 13, 2001 for joint meeting with the City Councils of Farmington Hills and Farmington and Farmington School Board; rescheduled City Council Goals Session Meeting from February 10th to February 8, 2001.
